make Jesus her center, her everything, and her all in all - Baby is trained that she is dearly loved but, loved so much, that she cannot be made the center, cannot be put in charge of the daily schedule, and cannot be the one determining the family's agenda for the day. Baby is lovingly and tenderly informed that the center position of her family is already taken when she arrived. It belongs exclusively to Jesus Christ.

The End Goal:

To train up a child who fears and loves God with all their heart soul mind and strength. A child who is fully given to the purposes of her rightful King Jesus. Her body is surrendered, her life bequeathed, and her future consecrated. Introducing the English Bowman

- An English Bowman was not built by accident. He was built on-purpose. And an English Bowman in the 1300 and 1400s England was their great secret of indomitable military strength - able to unleash up to 12 3-foot arrows a minute, shooting them with seemingly supernatural accuracy at lengths of up to 3 football fields, piercing even the most illustrious knight's armor as well as four-foot thick castle doors killing guards standing on the other side.
- The English Bowman of the 1300-1400s England still to this day are considered by Sports Scientists to be one of the most amazing physical specimens of human history. They were the special forces of their day - the elite athletes of war history.

The Building of an English Bowman

- To shoot an English Longbow demanded a lifetime of consistent training and the cultivation of immense strength - the ability to pull weights of up to 200 lbs. To supply perspective, the typical bow today has a pull weight of around 50-60 lbs. To pull a 6ft tall bow with a pull weight of 200 lbs would be considered by many today as simply impossible.

- For a twenty-year-old boy to be prepared to shoot an English Longbow he would need to start training as a little boy.
- The little boy would be taught the proper form and entrusted with a miniature longbow
- All throughout the boy's life, as his strength and ability increased, so would the size of his bow and so would the distance required for him to shoot
- Daily he would need to practice, for the archer's strength isn't just in his physical strength and technique, but also in his intimate familiarity with the movements of "bending the bow." And if he doesn't stay close and familiar with this difficult movement, he immediately loses his effectiveness as an archer.
- If this training was done diligently and right, the little boy would grow up with distinct deformities to his physical body. His left arm would show that he was, in fact, a bowman-in-training. His arm would bulge with muscular irregularity (think Popeye the Sailor man), possibly appearing strange and misshapen to those unfamiliar with how the art of archery effects a man's body. As a result, it was obvious to all that saw the lad that he was in training and that he was being groomed for the King's service.

The Training of Heavenly Bowman

- Heavenly bowman are not trained on accident but on purpose
- A Young bowman must be trained often and consistently
- You, as a parent, must accept the fact that your little bowman (or bowgirl) will look funny to the world as a result of this intensive training
- You must realize that he/she is being trained to present his/her life unto the King's military service and that they likely will die in combat
- And you mustn't listen to the overtures of the world around you that will naysay this intensive training
