VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

• Be 18 or older and either a current NICHE member, a homeschool graduate, or an adult who has demonstrated dedication toward homeschooling

OR

- Be at least 14 years old by June 1, 2019, with at least one parent who is a current NICHE member and will attend the 2019 Homeschool lowa Conference
- Attend training on SATURDAY, April 20, 10:00am-2:00pm and setup on THURSDAY, June 6, from 9:00am-4:00pm.
- Serve at the Children's Program ALL day, BOTH days, FRIDAY & SATURDAY, June 7-8.
- Be able to stay for at least ½ hour past the end of the last session on Saturday for tear-down and clean up
- Complete the volunteer application and background check application on or before May 25

ADVANCE TRAINING & THURSDAY SETUP

The training session on April 20 will include a facility tour, guidance on small group instruction, team building exercises, and time to practice the program songs and memory verses.

Thursday, June 6, is setup and facility decoration day for the children's program.

The drama team will have a final dress rehearsal.

Small group teams will receive final training and do a final run-though of the curriculum.

Parents of volunteers are welcome to stay and observe the training sessions and setup.

This is a required work day for all Children's Program volunteers.

VOLUNTEER BACKGROUND CHECKS

For the safety and security of all Homeschool lowa attendees and their children, Homeschool lowa Conference and Children's Program volunteers 16 years of age and older will be required to comply with a third party background check.

Due to the nature of the world we live in, those who refuse to comply will not be allowed to participate as volunteers.

Homeschool lowa utilizes a secure Christian organization to perform these background checks.

TEAMS & PROTOCOLS

TEAM ROLES

Due to the setup of our facility this year, we are adjusting our program format to large group lesson presentations and small group reinforcement activities.

On Thursday, all volunteers will help decorate the large group area and then make basic preparations in their small group areas. Any needed specific details regarding this will be sent out prior to the conference.

This is subject to adjustments and changes as we continue to plan our new format.

SMALL GROUP TEAMS

Instead of dividing the children into large classrooms, we will have smaller groups, much like VBS teams, with about 8-10 children guided by 2 volunteers.

Lessons will be taught in a large group, so small group guides are responsible for lesson review, memory verse review, and crafts. All team supplies and teaching supplements will be provided.

DRAMA TEAM

Every year we produce the highlight of each year's program: an 8-part drama.

The storyline of the drama directly connects with the lessons being taught, so that both the Gospel *and* Christian character lessons are taught throughout the program

Roles for extras may be available; information about this will be sent to volunteers in the weeks leading up to the conference.

Dress Code & Conduct

- Be neatly groomed in body and clothing.
 No gaudy or outlandish hairstyles or jewelry.
 (This applies to Thursday set-up hours as well.)
- Wear 2019 conference t-shirts on Friday and Saturday.
 Refrain from making embellishments or modifications (i.e. rolled sleeves, pins, etc.).
- Plan ahead in case the facility is chilly.
 Sweatshirts and jackets are not allowed over the conference t-shirts.
 You may wear a long-sleeved shirt under your conference t-shirt, if needed.
- Keep name tags visible around the neck at all times.
 Do not trade name tags with others.
- Wear modest denim jeans (no holes)
 or solid-color pants.
 Girls may wear denim or solid-color skirts
 that are below the knee, without revealing slits,
 and are not tight-fitting.
- Consider comfortable shoes a MUST.
- Adjust to a more relaxed dress code for Thursday: modest jeans, capris, or Bermuda shorts and loose-fitting shirts. Some returning volunteers wear a previous year's conference t-shirt.
- Expect to keep busy and help as needed.
 If a volunteer does not comply with this protocol, he/she will be asked to leave the conference.
- Plan to stay at least 1/2 hour after the end of the last Saturday session to assist with tear-down.
- Be prepared for a three long days of fast-paced, intensive work – and lots of fun!
