

SPECIAL MINOR'S RESTRICTED LICENSE

Information & Guidelines for Usage
by Students Under CPI or IPI



ELIGIBLE STUDENTS

14-18 year-olds who meet the following conditions:

- Has held an instructional permit for at least 6 months
- Has successfully completed an approved driver education course
- Has submitted certification from the primary CPI or IPI instructor
- Has received a written parent consent form, which must be carried by the student when driving, if the license will be used for travel to and from employment or farm work
- Has not had driving privileges revoked, suspended, or barred
- Has not been at fault for causing an accident or collision
- Has not been convicted of a moving vehicle violation

LICENSE PRIVILEGES

The licensee may operate a motor vehicle unsupervised:

- To attend duly scheduled CPI or IPI instruction
- To return home from duly scheduled CPI or IPI instruction
- To participate in extracurricular activities related to CPI or IPI
- To complete a scheduled work shift approved by the parent
- To assist the licensee's parent or employer with farm work
- To refuel the motor vehicle being used by the licensee
- If the licensee has the license in possession and uses the most direct route of no more than 25 miles between the origin and the destination

LICENSE RESTRICTIONS

When driving unsupervised with the SMRL, the licensee:

- Will not drive outside the hour before or after the beginning or end of the CPI or IPI instruction, extracurricular activity, work shift, or farm work
- Will not transport more than one passenger who is "unrelated" to the licensee; meaning not a minor sibling, a minor step-sibling, or a minor child residing in the same residence as the licensee
- Will not operate an electronic communication or entertainment device
- Will not travel to or from a place of employment or location of farm work without the parent's written consent form

Important to Note:

Make sure your student understands that the license will be suspended after only one instance of disobeying the license restrictions, causing an accident, or violating a moving vehicle operation law.
